The NCI CRCHD's Integrated Networks Branch is looking for a motivated individual to serve as a Program Director supporting its various programs. This individual will identify and formulate program needs to achieve an integrated and responsive effort in its network-based efforts to bridge disparities research, diversity training and community education/outreach in cancer and cancer health disparities.

As a Program Director in this branch, the selected candidate will plan, advise and direct program activities for a portfolio of research projects and grants or administrative supplement awards to manage state-of-the-art networks dedicated to integrating cancer research, diversity training and education/outreach efforts in underserved communities. Familiarity with the various NIH support mechanisms is desirable, and the ability to lead discussions with researchers, trainees/students and community health educators in the area of network-based connections is essential.

The successful candidate will have a master's or higher level degree (Ph.D., M.D., or D.V.M. preferred) in the behavioral or social sciences. A background in cancer/cancer health disparities is an asset, but not required. Expertise in the areas of community-based education, outreach, and dissemination science is preferred. Expertise or experience in community-based participatory research is desired. Fluency in written and spoken English is required, and bilingual capabilities are an asset. Motivation to serve as a team member in the Integrated Networks Branch is essential.
